

Travel Policy- Updated 12/16/2020

Under the Governor's current Regional Stay-at-Home Order, **all travel (including in-state) is prohibited** except for what is necessary for critical infrastructure. If you do travel, please adhere to our Travel Policy:

Travel Plans Form

- All travel, even that of a household member, must be reported on our Travel Plans Form.
- This applies to in-state, out-of-state, and international travel regardless of mode of transportation (car, train, airplane).

International travel (including Mexico, Alaska, Hawaii)

- May resume in-person learning 14 days after returning with proof of a negative PCR test (done at least 5 days after returning).
- Please contact school to confirm travel plans so there is no confusion about testing and return-to-school dates.

Domestic Out-Of-State Travel (excluding Alaska/Hawaii)

- May resume in-person learning 7 days after returning with proof of a negative PCR test (done at least 5 days after returning).
- Please contact school to confirm travel plans so there is no confusion about testing and return-to-school dates.

In-state Travel

- No additional quarantine or testing requirement to resume in-person learning, although we encourage families to get tested after returning from any travel.
- Will still need to adhere to all regular school procedures, including any quarantine or testing recommendations upon returning from school vacations (e.g., Winter Break).

Other reminders

- Regardless of travel, always follow good hygiene practices: wear masks, maintain distance, avoid gatherings, and wash hands frequently.
- All K-8 students may participate in virtual distance learning during any quarantine times.
- Please be aware that travel restrictions may change, and testing availability and results are becoming increasingly delayed. This may unexpectedly impact when your child can resume in-person learning.
